

2 Chronicles 9: The death of a nation

Why is this chapter famous? I keep saying that, yet this chapter marks the beginning of the end of Israel in the Old Testament history. To this point, Solomon had it all. He owned much of the promised land. He had wealth, women, and prestige. In this chapter, he put his mighty kingdom on display, yet he forgot Gods warning.

Deuteronomy 17:16-17 "The king, moreover, must not acquire great numbers of horses for himself or make the people return to Egypt to get more of them, for the Lord has told you, "You are not to go back that way again." 17 He must not take many wives, or his heart will be led astray. He must not accumulate large amounts of silver and gold."
