Reset Chapter 5 (Our spiritual life)

Questions for discussion

1. What to do with our Spiritual side?

We are Physical beings. We are also spiritual beings. Where is our character? Where is our soul? Why do we exist differently than other animals? We love, care, fight, and search for meaning. Do animals do that? We have a living spiritual side that is fueled by a spiritual God. Have you being wondering about the spiritual at times? Could it be God calling you to him? Maybe there is another side to you that is not in the mirror.

To reset ourselves means to come back to the beginning. Sometimes we need to revisit what messed us up. Spiritually, it is easy to get messed up. There is so much opportunity to explore the spiritual in our world. There are many vastly different kinds of churches. It's a smorgasbord for all types of people to feast on like Mormon, Baptist, Alliance, and hundreds of others. Dip into Astrology, Tarot cards, Satan worship, and many other forms of the spiritual. 2. We are messy people that are loved by God

We make mistakes. We do what is called sin. Rumour has it that God hates sin. That is true but there is another rumour: God loves the people he created. If you invented something and it didn't work right would you automatically throw it out? No, you would work at it until you succeed. It's the same with God, he is at work on his less than perfect messy people. If you took the time to read the Bible, you would see a process. From Eden to now God is making progress. Ok, I could go on and on about problems with in the church. It's not fair to the good churches to just tell the bad stuff. If you're done with religion; if you're done with church just look at me. I have been severely bombed by those who call themselves Christians. For some reason God wanted me to experience what so many of you have with Christians. However, I love what church represents. 5. In reality "We did it."

In our lives people let us down. Churches make bad decisions. I know people are not perfect. What if we cause quite a bit of our own pain? We don't leave a bad relationship. We run with the wrong crowd. We marry a risky person. Maybe we need to take more

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responsibility for our poor choices. Did Jesus let the church run amuck? Maybe we took what he meant for good and made it bad. In many of our life's choices "We did it."

To reset is to rethink about who did it. God set it up and provided all we need. He is willing to fuel our lives with the Holy Spirit. We must separate the actions of people with the actions of God. God gave but "WE" did it. We abused, cheated, and lied. We have agendas, theology, and sins. One thing is for sure. If Jesus is holy and sinless then who sinned in his church: WE DID!
