

Command one: Let there be Light

Genesis 1:3 "Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light."

If creation began in darkness, then from darkness we came. That seems so weird. Why do we have the terms dark and light anyways? I suppose they are the basic elements of the universe. In space there are two forms of matter. Photons (light matter) and what they call (anti-matter). I'm not so sure there is anti-matter but the science world believes in it.
