



Intro to the 10 commands of creation

I was listening to a sermon on creation and my ears perked up. The pastor caught me off guard when he listed the commands of creation. What? Then I went onto the all-powerful internet to inquire. Yep, there they were. Ten times God commanded creation to change. In this series I give eleven commands. One is far outside of creation but I believe it fits as God's last act to define humans. Speaking of humans, we do create things. Someone said the other day that humans created some things that should not exist. I'd like to explore that.

This series is all about coming from nothing. One of the main reasons I am shocked at the modern scientist is their lack of the definite. They can't define how it happened. Oh sure, they smugly say this is how creation happened. We can all say that love is the answer. Yet, actions in the name of love are the answer. We are known by our actions that mirror our words. A scientist can say that the Big Bang is the beginning, but the elephant in the room remains. Where did that particle, that exploded, come from? Why did it exist for infinity and then explode? One of the main reasons the sun and planets don't explode is harmony. The equalization between inner pressure and outer pressure. Our bodies work on the same principle between blood pressure and gravity. Science tries to explain how, and why. Yet, the elephant is design. They can see it but can't explain it.

Historians agree that the Genesis account of creation is old. Whoever wrote it gave us a small and vaguely detailed account of how the universe exists. Where did God come from? How

could he have created something from nothing? The complexity of the human body is astounding. The harmony in space is hard to quantify right down to molecules and beyond. Random did not create this universe. The proof is everywhere. Most of creation works in harmony within itself.
