

## John 1:1

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

I really wonder if there is a bigger statement in the Bible? It says go reach the world in Matthew 28. We have the audacious claim that God created the world in Genesis 1. John 3:16 talks about the love of God. There are plenty more. Everyone has their favorite verse. Even unbelievers know at least one statement in the Bible. Yet, this one verse is piercing truth, controversial, and outrageous. Is it real or just pretty poetry? John 1:1 is as mysterious as it gets.

In the beginning the Spirit of God hovered over the waters. Some Holy man wrestled with Jacob in Genesis 32. Time after time something spiritual has appeared. There are theologians that say it is the Christ incarnate. Fancy term but it might mean that Jesus appeared in the past in another form. Is it true? Could it be right? The Bible does not say. Yet, John says Jesus was the word. That word in verse 2 is God from the very beginning.

So, how does John know? Well, I feel there is two ways. Did you know that John wrote Revelation? He was visited by God and was given things to write down. Secondly, John spent time with Jesus. Three years is a long time. How many things did John hear that are not in the Bible. In his last verse in John 21 he stated there were plenty that he never wrote down. Controversial? Convenient? Impossible? It's all those things and more.

At times Jesus just spoke Bible verses. At times he said he was Bible verses. Over and over Jesus seemed like the walking Bible. He obviously knew it better than some scholars. Even
