The controversy: Is the Holy Spirit real?

Controversy?

Have you ever flicked the channels on your TV when all of a sudden you're transfixed by what you see? There is a man or woman standing on a stage with their hands raised to the heavens. In front of them is a sick or disabled person crying out to the Lord in heaven for mercy. You hear the person with their hands raised call out for the Holy Spirit of God to heal the person before them. They press their hands upon the needy and (Boom) they are healed. A scene like this has cause controversy over this entity called The Holy Spirit or Holy Ghost.

Who is this brooding apparition that appears to have as much power as God himself? Many people call on the Holy Spirit to heal them, talk to God for them, or save them from certain destruction. Is this Holy Ghost real? I was reading an article by a Rabi who felt that the Holy Spirit is alive and well in the Old Testament. She did however caution the readers on making Gods Spirit a person. In Christianity the Spirit is one of three people who make up what is called the Godhead. Is this Spirit a person and equal with Jesus and God the Father?

In the first 6 centuries the discussion over the purpose of the Spirit rages on. Some said the Spirit is a person while others said no. There seems to be no question something exists spiritually with God but what? There is plenty of controversy. Is the Spirit from God or from Jesus? Can humans wield the power of this Spirit? Does the spirit speak through people? Was this spirit here on earth the whole time? There are so many questions about this Holy power of God.

There are churches that are built on the assumption the Holy Spirit is alive and well within us. They exist by signs and wonders performed by the Spirit of God. Some say you are known by your gifts of the spirit. Do we get spiritual gifts from a Holy Ghost? Do miracles come from the Spirit? They say this Spirit sits inside a Christian forever. One of the biggest controversies is that this spirit claims to be sealed within those who believe in God, is that true? This Spirit seems to cause trouble and healing all at the same time. There are plenty of controversies here. What do you believe?

<u>Maybe?</u>

To say "Maybe" the Spirit of God exists; let's take a quick look at the history of this Spirit. In the first verse of the Bible we have our first intro and controversy over the Spirit of God. Gen 1:1 **"In the beginning, God created the universe. These Christians use the power of the Spirit to heal others by laying hands on them. They call on the Spirit to help people believe in God. Many Christians believe that the Spirit administers Special Godly gifts (a talent or function) to be used by God in this world. Maybe we can see

Christians helping others through their gifts to make this world a better place like Samaritans purse, the Salvation Army, or your local church.

They say the Spirit drives Christians to do the will of God. Is it this same Spirit that changes people to be kinder and nicer? Maybe this Spirit does exist because we have witnessed people changed by Christianity. Even in the Old Testament the Spirit came upon people and they were empowered by this Holy Ghost. Sometimes people are moved by God. It appears he uses a power, force, or Spirit to get the job done. Jewish people call it Gods essence. Either way something drives some people to do things for a God we cannot see. Maybe it's the unseen Holy Ghost. What do you believe?

<u>Yes?</u>

I asked God one night to help me in my marriage troubles. Since that night my world has changed. My view on life has also changed. What did that? Several times I have had small visions of things and they have come true over time. Maybe I was dreaming and made them happen? Maybe the Holy Spirit gave me insight of things I was supposed to do? I can clearly see why some would chose to disbelieve.

Why do they love to see things that they say do not exist? The Spirit is said to do a lot of its work through Gods Bible. You read it and God speaks to your heart through the Spirit. If the Bible is the same as all other books then why are people changed by it and not by Stephan King? Some people just have to say "No" the Spirit is imaginary. If that's true then this 4000 year old Christian Jewish thing just won't last. What do you believe?
